Desire Wilson - 1st and only woman to win in a Formula One race of any kind.

Michèle Mouton - Won the world famous Pikes Peak Hillclimb in 1985.

Shawna Robinson - 1st woman to qualify on the pole at a NASCAR Busch Series race.

Lyn St. James - Set world closed course speed records, had victories in the IMSA Camel GT Series, and was the first woman to win the Indianapolis 500 Rookie of the Year in 1992.
